- Recommend membership sanctions to the executive board
- Offer advice and assistance to individual communicators
- Assist with related professional development activities

- Our 2015 Activities
 - Confirmed confidentiality and conflict of interest requirements
 - Developed case management process
 - Engaged with chapter leaders and members
 - Advised IEB and Chapter leaders on ethics cases
 - Conflict of interest
 - Attribution
 - Event speaker fees
 - Inappropriate use of IABC brand
- Our current focus simplifying and validating our Code of Ethics
